Progress on Journey Toward Vitality

- People professing their faith in Jesus through our churches increased by a whopping 112 percent.
- Total professing membership increased 2.4 percent.
- Weekly average attendance in Sunday School or other weekly education classes increased by 17 percent.

Progress on the Journey Toward Vitality (cont'd)

- People served by our community ministries of outreach, justice, and mercy increased 11 percent to 193,954 individuals.
- We are engaged in 18 church plants and multiplication projects across the Dakotas Conference.
- For the seventh consecutive year, the Dakotas had an increase in average worship attendance—which grew by 5.5 percent.
